#### **RECORD RELIEF & EXPUNGEMENT**

Do you have a prior arrest or juvenile court record? Attorneys from *LAF* provide general information about how juvenile records and criminal records impact a youth's job search. In addition, the attorneys will provide free resources about how youth can expunge or seal juvenile and criminal records to find or keep good jobs.

#### **SCHOOL RE-ENGAGEMENT**

**SOAR Center:** Are you behind in your high school credits? Do you need help catching up so you can graduate on time? Representatives from Chicago Public Schools' **Student Outreach and Re-Engagement (SOAR) Centers** will be available to provide assistance with getting back into school. SOAR re-engages out-of-school and chronically truant youth and serves as a location for families seeking support to re-enroll in school. The 4 SOAR centers are integrated into community based organizations and located in neighborhoods with high populations of dropouts and with nearby Option Schools and Programs: Garfield Park (JLM Center), Little Village (Central States SER), Roseland (Phalanx Family Services) and Englewood (Salvation Army).

Olive Harvey Community College: Students pursuing classes in the Transportation, Distribution and Logistics (TDL) College to Careers focus prepares you for a career in an in-demand industry. Students will learn about careers and businesses involved in the planning, management and movement of people, materials and products. Olive Harvey also has an Associate in Applied Science Degree (AAS) Supply Chain Management and Logistics. Students in the following transportation, distribution and logistics fields, as in Commercial Driver's License (CDL A, B, and C), Forklift, Taxi, Limo, and coming soon Automotive Technology and Diesel Technology, learn and practice skills which prepare them for diverse post-high school education and training opportunities. Olive-Harvey College partners with leading companies and universities to ensure programs reflect real-world workforce demands and offer real-world learning opportunities.

**Moraine Valley - Career Connections Youth Program** is a work readiness program for qualifying young adults ages 18-24. We provide assistance in several areas through our F.O.C.U.S. (Financial and Occupational Coaching for Universal Success) classes developing skills such as:

- Development and Mastery of usable work skills through a series of workshops that concentrate on academic readiness, career pathways and work readiness, internships and job placements
- Mentoring
- Pre-employment skills training
- Academic guidance and counselling
- Internships

Participants who successfully complete F.O.C.U.S. can earn up to 1.5 vocational college credits through our program. Participants may also be eligible for up to \$8K in tuition assistance at approved training providers within Cook County. We are located in MVCC's Blue Island Education Center, at 12940 S. Western Avenue.

**Going to College? CHA can help!** Residents of the Chicago Housing Authority have access to numerous resources to support their college success. CHA awards over 200 scholarships each year, ranging between \$1,000-\$2,500, to support students attending colleges locally and nationwide. Also, CHA has a partnership with the City Colleges of Chicago called the Partners in Education program which provides voucher support covering tuition, books and fees at CCC after financial aid is applied.

**Family Legacy Foundation** has received a grant from the US Department of Education to help adults (19 and older) improve their educational attainment levels. We offer the following services to individuals FREE of charge:



- Academic, personal, career, and academic counseling
- . Guidance on General Educational Development (GED) programs or other alternative education programs
- . Assistance completing college admission and financial aid applications
- Financial and economic literacy education and counseling

## CHILDCARE SUPPORT SERVICES

The **Teen Parent Project** of Illinois Action for Children assists teen parents residing in Cook County 19 years-of-age and younger with specialized services to ensure that child care does not become a barrier for them to remain in school. The Teen Parent Project's well-equipped, professionally trained Parent Consultants and Family Resource Specialists help teen parents find a child care arrangement that works for them.

## JOBSEEKER SCREENING + PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

**The Endeleo Institute** is a member organization and community development arm of Trinity United Church of Christ. Part of Endeleo's mission is to serve and engage young people in Washington Heights and surrounding communities to keep them safe and from becoming victims or perpetrators of violence. To this end, we provide educational and workforce development programs throughout the year.

**DESI - Washington Heights Workforce Center** offers job seekers a variety of job search services and resources from many partner agencies. The WHWC is part of the State's Illinois workNet® system. Many of our offered services are federally-funded, including vocational training. Job seekers, who have been laid off, are low-income, or a youth who has dropped out of school, may be eligible for these services at no cost.

We provide targeted job search assistance; coordinated placement services; career assessment and training referrals; and one-on-one career management and support services.

Our **Employer Services include:** screening and recruitment; industry-specific training; and ongoing placement support.

**Marriott Foundation "Bridges...from school to work"** is a transition program established in 1989 by the Marriott Foundation for People with Disabilities (aka The Marriott Foundation) to foster the employment success of young people with disabilities. The program develops opportunities for work and vocational development for young people with disabilities as they leave high school.

**Gary Comer Youth Center:** One of the most unique youth-serving organizations in Chicago, Comer Education Campus inspires young people to pursue their passions and to succeed in high school, college and careers. Our campus is comprised of Gary Comer Youth Center, Gary Comer College Prep, Gary Comer Middle School and the college success initiative, UtmostU.



The *Illinois Department of Employment Security* Hire the Future program is for youth ages 16-24. The program provides services to increase employability, assist youth in making informed career decisions, and assist youth in building skills and positive work habits.

Called the "Miracle on 103rd Street," *Metropolitan Family Services Calumet Center* has been serving families on Chicago's far South Side since 1955, with programs ranging from youth leadership and economic development to senior care and violence intervention. Metropolitan Calumet is part of Metropolitan Family Services, which has been powering Chicago-area families to reach their greatest potential and positively impact their communities since 1857.

**Year Up** is an intensive, educational and professional skills training program focused on preparing motivated young adults (ages 17-24 with a high school diploma or GED and the legal right to work in the US) for corporate careers in one of our 4 educational tracks: **Business Operations, Financial Operations, IT and Sales and Customer Support**.

The first 6 months of the program are focused on college coursework and professional skills training. After successful completion of the training, students are placed on a six month internship with a major corporation. Year Up has achieved wonderful outcomes including 100% placement of qualified students in internships and 85% of graduates employed or in school full time within 4 months of completion with starting salary of approximately \$37K a year.

**Aunt Martha's** Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Program services out of school youth ages 18-24 years of age with free Employment training, Education Assistance, Employment Placement Services and an array of Supportive Services. To qualify for the Youth WIOA Program youth would need to attend an orientation session to complete an application and basic skills testing, bring documentation with proof of age (Driver's license, State Id card), education status (High school diploma or G.E.D.), Proof of parenting (Child's Birth certificate or statement), and/or proof of Low-Income status (Check stubs, documentation of services from the Department of Human Services i.e. Tanf or Snap program).

Aunt Martha's Agency also offers Healthcare and dental services, youth temporary housing and child welfare services with multiple locations. More information can be found on our website: <a href="https://www.auntmarthas.org">www.auntmarthas.org</a>.
